## **CLUB SCHEDULE**

During the off-season (April to Sept), the club is closed on Mondays and Tuesdays. Our hours are Wednesday through Sunday from 8:00am to 5:00pm.

During the hunting season (Oct to March), the club is closed on Mondays. We are open Tuesday through Friday from 7:30am to 5:00pm and Saturday and Sunday from 7:00am to 5:00pm.

Please respect our closing time of 5:00pm all year round.

## **HOLIDAY SCHEDULE**

Thanksgiving Day-7:30am until Noon, by reservation only. The kitchen is closed. Coffee and rolls will be available.

Christmas Eve-7:30am until 3:00pm Christmas Day-CLOSED New Year's Eve-7:30am until 3:00pm New Year's Day-CLOSED

### RESTAURANT SCHEDULE

The kitchen is open during the hunting season only. Tuesday through Friday, breakfast is available from 9am to 11am, unless earlier reservations are made 24 hours in advance. Lunch is available from 11am until 2pm.

On Saturdays and Sundays, breakfast is available from 7:30am until 11am and lunch from 11am until 2pm.

#### SAFETY ALERT: BLUE-GREEN ALGAE CAN KILL YOUR DOG.

Blue-green algae looks like a "pea soup" scum that floats on the water... but it's actually bacteria. Not all blue-green algae blooms produce toxins, but there is no way to know for certain with the naked eye which ones are harmful. People can become very ill when the skin comes into contact with toxic blooms. The same is true for your dog, but it can be deadly if they lick or drink any of it. The toxins can cause symptoms in your dog in as little as 30-60 minutes after your dog is exposed to the toxins, but may take up to 12 to 24 hours to appear. It is critical to take your dog to the vet as soon as possible if any of the following symptoms appear:



- \* Diarrhea
- \* Vomiting
- \* Blood in stool
- \* Pale mucous membranes
- \* Jaundice
- \* Seizures, muscle tremors, muscle rigidity, or paralysis
- \* Disorientation
- \* Coma
- \* Excessive salivation or tearing
- \* Blue discoloration of the coat, skin, andmucous membranes
- \* Difficulty breathing

If you suspect blue-green algae poisoning, rinse of your dog with fresh water ASAP. If your dog licked or drank any water, get him to a vet immediately. You can also give him activated charcoal (UAA, Universal Antidote Gel, is available at veterinary suppliers and on Amazon. This comes in an easy-to-dose syringe that you can use right in your dog's mouth). If your vet cannot get you in immediately, go to the nearest emergency clinic.

If you see this blue-green algae "pea soup" scum...stay away! To the best of our knowledge we do not have any of this blue-green algae here at Halter. Al does not want to start wide spread panic, this is just a little information to keep you aware.

### SAFETY

As we welcome the new hunting season with great anticipation and excitement, Al would like to reiterate that safety is of the utmost importance here at Halter. You MUST wear blaze orange on your head when hunting, no exceptions. Blaze orange is required to be showing on at least 50% of your outerwear. The more blaze orange, the better. We want this season to be our safest season yet. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.
