Halter Wildlife's third annual dog trial is just around the corner. We would like to highlight 2022's winners, 1st place retriever: Marc Lubkeman with springer spaniel "Cooper" and 1st place pointer: Grant Alderman with "Ava"

Put your dog to the test with bird recovery, retrieve, obedience, and water retrieval. Each dog will get a 20-minute run, we will place 2 chukars for each dog.

Rules:

- No electric collars
- Dogs must be on leash until their run starts
- When the dog is finished with the run after 20 minutes, they must be leashed and brought back to the vehicle

Scoring:


- 10 points will be given for each bird found
- 10 points for each retrieve
- 10 points for obedience
- 10 points for water work (water retrieval)



HALTER HITS A BULLSEYE WITH NEW SHOOTING PAVILION

This summer the club has updated the rifle and pistol range located in the Back Forty.

The pavilion covers two new shooting benches with built-in rifle racks, and a bench for observers at the hundred yard mark and has been dedicated to one of Halter's most special members, **William** "Bill" Ivy. Bill passed away in 2021. He was a longtime member of the Halter Wildlife Board, and held the position of treasurer for nine years. Due to Bill's experience and significant personal time he spent at the club, Halter has maintained excellent financial health over the years.

Many of our members knew of Bill's love of shooting, from black powder to large caliber rifles, and chances are you would find Bill at the rifle range, shooting or helping others with their rifles and sighting in for their upcoming hunts.

It's only fitting that our updated amenity of the rifle range be named in honor of Bill.



Roast Pheasant

This roast pheasant recipe is quick, simple, and has an autumn feel. It is very good roasted with diced potatoes, carrots, and seasonal squash

Ingredients

- 2 sprigs rosemary, leaves stripped and chopped
- 1 tablespoon chopped fresh thyme
- 1 cup olive oil
- 1 whole pheasant, cleaned
- salt and ground black pepper to taste

Cooking Instructions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 250° F
- 2. Stir rosemary and thyme into olive oil in a liquid measure; set aside.
- 3. Rub pheasant inside and out with salt and pepper. Place into a close-fitting roasting pan. Pour herb oil over pheasant.
- 4. Bake in the preheated oven for 1 hr., then cover with aluminum foil and continue baking until an instant-read thermometer inserted into the thickest part of the thigh, near the bone, reads 180° F, about 1 hr. more. Baste pheasant with pan juices every 30 minutes during baking.
- 5. Remove from the oven, cover with a doubled sheet of aluminum foil, and allow to rest in a warm area for 10 minutes before slicing.
